## ISLAND-BASED PARTNERSHIPS AND STATEWIDE COORDINATION TO ADDRESS INCIPIENT INVASIVE PESTS.

Addressing Hawaii's invasive species problems requires better prevention measures, rapid response and monitoring of incipient pests, and continued control of established pests. The Coordinating Group on Alien Pest Species (CGAPS), a government/nongovernment partnership has worked since 1994 to address policy and funding issues for these three areas of need. While policy issues still exist, one area of great success has been with the formation of Invasive Species Committees (ISCs) to function as rapid response and monitoring crews on each island. The ISCs are island-based grassroots government/non-government/private business partnerships working to protect each island from the most threatening invasive pests. Each ISC has a list of priority target species, pests that were evaluated and ranked to determine the level of threat and potential for control. Field crews survey, map, control and monitor priority targets such as *Miconia* (Miconia calvescens). Since July 2001, the ISCs have surveyed 54,018 acres and controlled 637,064 Miconia statewide, including 333,957 seeding trees. Additional work by the ISCs include rapid response to reports of coqui frogs in areas where they are not known to exist, like Molokai and Kauai, and snake and veiled chameleons searches on Maui. ISCs provide the necessary manpower to assist the under-staffed Hawaii Departments of Agriculture and Land and Natural Resources in searches and control work. The amount of control work shows the success of the ISC partnerships and the continuing need for dedicated rapid response crews.
